### Part I. Introduction

### 1.1 Purpose and objectives of the entrance examination

The purpose of the entrance examination in English is to determine the level of language competence of an applicant to the objectives of foreign language learning aimed at the development of skills of linguistic knowledge system, including knowledge of basic concepts at all language levels and patterns of functioning of the studied languages, functional varieties of language.

Entrance examination in English has the following objectives:

- 1. to determine level of practical skills of applicants entering bachelor's programs;
- 2. to select applicants who are able and prepared to study under a bachelor's program in the field of English;
- 3. to assess an applicant's level of developed communicative competence in English.

## 1.2 General requirements for the organization of entrance examinations

This program is based on the requirements to the mandatory minimum content and level of training of a bachelor student, defined by the current Federal State Educational Standard for Higher Education.

### 1.3. Description of the format of entrance examinations

The format of the entrance examination in English for applicants to the bachelor's programs is a test, which is held using remote technologies and / or in person on the date, time and in the examination room, which were specified in advance by the KFU Admissions Committee. The format of the entrance examination shall be chosen by an applicant himself/herself within the deadline set by the Admissions Committee.

One day prior or on the closest working day to the examination date, a consultation in remote and/or in-person format should be arranged for applicants. A link to the online consultation shall be posted on the Admissions Committee web page on the date set by the Admissions Committee. Online consultation is held within the period set by the Admissions Committee. In-person consultation shall be held at a time and in a room specified in advance by the Admissions Committee. An applicant can independently choose a format for consultation.

### 1.4 Duration of entrance examinations in minutes

Applicants have 2 astronomical hours (120 minutes) for the entrance examination in English, both for the examination in remote format and in person.

### 1.5 Structure of entrance examinations

The exam tasks contain a lexical and grammatical test and a written assignment in essay format. To differentiate examinees by levels of foreign language proficiency within the limits set forth in the Federal Component of the State Standard of Secondary (Complete) General Education for Foreign Languages, along with the tasks of the basic level, the test contains tasks of high and advanced levels.

The entrance examination is of a competitive nature and includes completion of examination test aimed at determining the level of proficiency in the system of basic, high and advanced knowledge and skills of a bachelor's program applicant.

The entrance examination has five blocks of tasks, which include multiple-choice tasks and open-ended tasks, where applicants enter words on the computer keyboard or write them in with a pen on the provided answer sheet.

## Part II. Program Content

The lexical and grammatical tasks test the skills of using grammatical and lexical units on the basis of provided texts. The lexical and grammatical test includes tasks for testing practical knowledge of the grammatical and lexical system of the English language, the level of development

of linguistic competence - a set of knowledge about the language system (grammatical, lexical, morphological, syntactic and stylistic levels) and the ability to use them in written communication. Successful completion of the lexical and grammatical tasks requires knowledge of the verb tenses, passive voice, subjunctive mood, prepositions, conditionals, degrees of comparison of adjectives and adverbs, plural forms of nouns, direct and indirect speech, modal verbs, forms and ways of using infinitives and gerunds, complex objects, complex subjects, phrasal verbs, collocations, idiomatic expressions, lexical units above Intermediate level, ability to form a word with the same root from a given word.

The basic, advanced and high levels of difficulty of the examination tasks correlate with the levels of foreign language proficiency defined in the documents of the Council of Europe.

Maximum score for tasks 1-25 is 2 points, for tasks 26-35 - 3 points, for task 36 - 20 points.

## Part III. Assessment materials 3.1 Instruction on task performance

Applicants have 2 astronomical hours (120 minutes) to complete examination in English. Before beginning the task, the applicant should carefully read the formulation of the task in order to ensure compliance with the requirements for the execution of the answer. Answers for entrance examination tasks in English can be letters, words, sentences or an extended written statement.

The examination work consists of five parts with 36 tasks:

- A) An answer for questions 1-10 is a word or a phrase.
- B) An answer for questions 11-25 is a letter.
- C) An answer for questions 25-35 is a word.
- D) An answer for question 36 is an essay for a specified topic. Word count for the essay is 200-250 words.

All answers in **tasks 1-35** should be written in CAPITAL block letters in both <u>online and inperson formats</u>.

In <u>online format</u>, an applicant shall write the answer to **task 36** in any word processor available on the computer on which the test is administered. If an applicant is unable to use a word processor for objective reasons, the answer to task 36 can be written down with a pen on a piece of paper and then photographed on a personal phone and attached to the "Choose a File" icon. In online format, an applicant must also use standard writing rules; spaces and necessary punctuation marks should be placed between words.

<u>In in-person format</u>, answers to questions 1-35 shall be written in answer sheet No. 1 on the right-hand side of the task number, beginning from the first box, without spaces, commas, or other additional characters. Each letter of the answer should be written in a separate box. All letters in the answer shall be in CAPITALS. Example:

Applicants are allowed to use a draft papers when completing tasks in in-person format. Notes in draft papers are not considered in assessing examination works.

The points received by an applicant for the completed tasks will be summed up and converted into final score.
